
Warm greetings from NGMA Bengaluru! There has been a long interval after the third issue of the NGMA e-newsletter. One reason is that we have been so busy with holding events that there was little time for chronicling them. There were two large exhibitions in the NGMA between May and October. The first was a wonderful retrospective of the photo journalist Homai Vyarawalla which generated tremendous interest and was accompanied by a rich plethora of outreach programmes. The other, which was the first exhibition initiated and organized by NGMA Bengaluru, was a retrospective of KK Hebbar, whose birth centenary was celebrated this year.

For perhaps the first time, more than 180 works of this wonderful artist were exhibited together, showing the development and changes in his thinking and art over the years. The exhibition **An Artist's Quest: KK Hebbar – A Retrospective** was on view from 21st August till 20th October and was accompanied by 15 outreach programmes, including a puppet show based on the **Silappadhikaram**, which Hebbar had illustrated with 51 drawings which were on view at the exhibition.

NGMA Bengaluru also organized a large number of other interesting events during this time, including the celebration of World Heritage Day in April with lectures and films on heritage and conservation. We now eagerly look forward to the large variety of events scheduled for December and January and to the exhibition of the works of the Bangalore based landscape artist Rumale Chennabasaviah – *Varna Mythri: Rumale Chennabasaviah – Centenary Retrospective 2011.*

# **FILM SCREENINGS**

#### 1) APRIL 2011

The last of the films from the Travelling Film South Asia festival was screened on the 10th of April. The films based on the stories of individuals from different parts of the South Asia who continue to be on the fringes of society, were very well received by the audience.

### 2) 17<sup>TH</sup> – 30<sup>TH</sup> APRIL, 2011

NGMA Bengaluru in collaboration with Marg, celebrated World Heritage Day by screening films on heritage sites. A total of 8 short films on various historical and archeological sites in India were shown over the weekends. The films were conceptualized by the art historian Vidya Dehejia and directed by Shyam Benegal.

### 3) 9<sup>TH</sup> – 24<sup>TH</sup> JULY, 2011

A French Film Festival was screened in collaboration with the Alliance Francaise, featuring films on artists such as Picasso, Degas, Cezanne and Courbet, among others.

### 4) 23<sup>RD</sup> OCTOBER, 2011

## **TALKS AND EVENTS**

1) On the 12th of March, NGMA Bengaluru, in collaboration with SPACES, Chennai, held a memorial for Dashrath Patel, the artist and designer. The memorial function began with an invocation from Kabir, sung by Shabnam Virmani. This was followed by a documentary film by Iffat Fatima on the artist.

**2) On March 26th,** NGMA Bengaluru collaborated with the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) to present a dance performance of the Serai-kelle Chhau. The dance was performed by the much admired troupe, Trinetra Chhau Dance Centre, which has already toured many countries under the cultural exchange programme of the ICCR.

**3)** On the 27th March, NGMA Bengaluru, the Centre for Film and Drama (CFD) and Radha Kalpa, collaborated to present a theatrical production titled The Lady of Burma on the life of the Burmese leader Aung San Suu Kyi. The play was directed by noted theatre personality Prakash Belawadi, and featured the danseuse Rukmini Vijayakumar in a solo performance. The play which was based on a script written by Richard Shannon, had toured widely in Europe and America to popular as well as critical acclaim.

**4)** Under the initiative of Carte Blanche, Vasudev C, a performance artist, utilized the grounds of NGMA Bengaluru **on the 8th of April,** to present a contemporary dance performance titled Unwinding the Past.

**5)** To celebrate World Heritage Day which fell **on the 18th of April,** NGMA Bengaluru collaborated with INTACH Bengaluru to present three thought provoking talks on conservation of art and architecture.

6) On the 25th of June, a condolence meet was held by NGMA Bengaluru in order to mark the passing away of the artist MF Husain.

7) On 30th of July, a Bharatanayam dance recital by one of ICCR's empanelled artists, Rajashree R. Warrier was performed at the auditorium of NGMA Bengaluru.

**8) On the 7th of August,** Deepak.K.Shivaswamy and Veena Basavarajaiah presented a performance under NGMA Bengaluru's Carte Blanche initiative. This event was a movement installation portraying the socio political dimensions of water and human existence.

**9) On the 25th of August,** NGMA Bengaluru collaborated with ICCR to present a musical concert by ICCR's empanelled artist Rekha Surya who combined Amir Khusro's Sufi Poetry with Faiz's ghazals, to mark the celebration of the Faiz centenary in 2011.

**10)** Artrends, the quarterly art journal, which ran from 1961 to 1982, and has now been complied as a book by the Lalit Kala Akademi was released at NGMA Bengaluru **on 10th September.**


## **EXHIBITIONS**

#### 8<sup>TH</sup> MAY- 8<sup>TH</sup> JULY, 2011

The retrospective exhibition of Homai Vyarawalla, India's first woman photojournalist, opened at NGMA Bengaluru, on the 8th of May. Featuring works from the collection of the Alkazi Foundation for the Arts, Delhi, the show was curated by Sabeena Gadihoke. The exhibition presented 220 works of Vyarawalla, who photographed the last few days of the British Empire in India, and the birth of new India. The cameras and equipment which she used during that period were also on display during the show. Parallel outreach programmes comprising of talks, films, workshops and docent walks were organized through the duration of the exhibition at NGMA Bengaluru.

#### 20<sup>TH</sup> AUGUST- 20<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER, 2011

The first curated exhibition originating from NGMA Bengaluru **An Artist's Quest – K K Hebbar – a retrospective,** opened to present a chronological reading of the versatile artist's works. The exhibition was curated by the artist Rekha Rao and the art historian Rajani Prasanna. The two months of the exhibition was accompanied by fifteen outreach programmes, which highlighted different aspects of the works on display. The outreach programmes, which included talks, panel discussions, films, workshops, docent walks and even a puppet show on the Shilappathikaram, were extremely well received. A new initiative for the Hebbar exhibition was that the State Government on the request of NGMA, agreed to reimburse the travel fares of students from art schools in different parts of Karnataka, who came to Bangalore to see the Hebbar exhibition. This enabled students from art schools in Gulbarga, Davangere, Karvar, and Mysore to come and visit the exhibition.



## WORKSHOPS

From the 9th of July till the 31st, over the course of four weekends NGMA Bengaluru initiated a workshop on art appreciation at its premises, titled **Engaging Art: a public workshop on visual cultures.** The facilitators at the workshop were, the artist Ravi Kashi, art historian Annapurna Garimella, artist Ramesh Chandra and the arts writer Lina Vincent. The workshop was greatly appreciated by the participants and the feedback was very encouraging.






**1, 2** - Scenes from the restrospective exhibition of Homai Vyarawalla that opened at NGMA Bengaluru on 8th of May, 2011
