Of the two popular styles of sitar, one has been named after Hidayat's father as a Vilayat Khan or gayaki style. As an instrument, the sitar has evolved over time and across centuries from its humble beginnings. Hidayat's flexible and genre-defying musical style engages and pushes the instrument in new and novel ways. The descendant and proponent of one of the most treasured lineages of Eastern classic music, Hidayat harbors a rare, creative brilliance that effortlessly takes him across all genres and nuances of music. Hidayat's adeptness is evident as he intricately plays the sitar from the classical gharana style and has successfully worked on adaptions of the sitar's sounds in western popular music. He is also well-versed in the 'Gayaki Ang', a unique rendition where voice blends with the instrument. Do not miss this exclusive evening filled with music, memories and more!
