#### ABOUT




## PRINT MAKING 28TH MAY - 6TH JUNE


## ART OF DOCUMENTARY FILM MAKING


### PAINTING 6TH JUNE - 16TH JUNE














# DISCOVERING MYSELF THROUGH ART AND CREATIVITY 6TH JUNE - 16TH JUNE






## ART WORKSHOP FOR THE SPECIALLY ABLED




















### LIFE STUDY 17TH JUNE - 26TH JUNE




