Tribute to Rabindranath Tagore is a raaga-based experiment to explore Rabindranath Tagore's music. Tagore has fused many musical traditions through his genius. He synthesised Hindustani classical music, Carnatic music, Indian folk tunes, western symphonies and western country music into what came to be known as Rabindra Sangeet.

Neela Bhagwat, a leading exponent of Gwalior gharana, has paid a tribute to Tagore through her pioneering effort in Robi Anuraag. She has taken some of Tagore's poignant lyrics and composed Hindustani bandish while retaining the original message and spirit of Tagore's Sangeet. Neela has adapted Tagore's songs into raaga-based compositions. The adaptation has been done by using such raagas as best express the mood of the corresponding Rabindra Sangeet.

The four songs of Tagore have been chosen to express the eternal aspiration for hope and courage amidst fear and despair. They are an assertion of faith in the enduring human spirit in times of hatred and violence. Soma Sen has rendered the original Rabindra Sangeet while Neela Bhagwat has written, composed and rendered the Hindustan classical versions.
